Dear Peevees family,



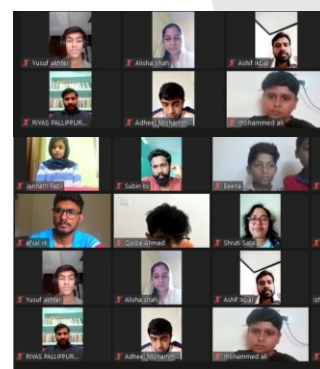


Happy Chocolate Day

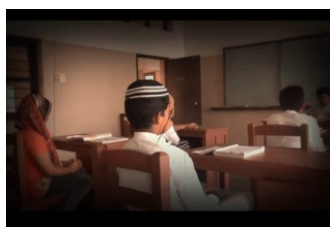
Back to the Pavilion Teacher's reporting to school

Remember Me - Vaikom Muhammad Basheer - Writer of Malayalam

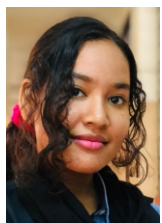
